
Survey of Anne Middlebrooks 640 acres, 7 January 1781, on the waters of Hogan's Creek, Caswell County, North Carolina




Survey plat for John Middlebrooks of Caswell County, 30 acres, witnessed by Sims Middlebrooks, 10 April 1784. The survey was ordered 1 April 1781. (Grant #864, issued 18 August 1787, Entry #1243, Book 68, Pg. 76, ancestry.com)



31 August 31 1782, Anne Middlebrooks, for the love of her son, Isaac, conveys to him 195 acres along the south side of Hogan's Creek, Caswell County, North Carolina adjoining Henry Dixon, part of a larger tract. (Deed Book A, Pg 602) Witnesses: Presly Lutteral, Robert Lyon and Abram Perkins. (Caswell County, Deed Book A, Pg. 602, Registrar of Deeds Office, Yanceyville, NC.)



17 March 1788, Anne Middlebrooks of Caswell County confirms the sale of 100 acres lying in Caswell County to Joel Cannon, adjoining Henry Dixon, being land Joel Cannon, bought of Isaac Middlebrooks, Witnesses: John Middlebrooks, William Carmon and James Perkins. (Deed Book E, Pg. 286)



On 21 December 1785, Isaac Middlebrooks starts the land entry process for twenty and one-half acres on the south side of Hogan's Creek. The State patent also being issued 18 August 1787. (Deed Book D, Pg. 286)

1 October 1781, John Middlebrooks began the same land entry process as his mother to purchase thirty acres on the south side of Hogan's Creek. The State patent was issued the same day as his mother's on 18 August 1787. (Deed Book D, Pg. 334)




