Carol Jean (Jean) Shroyer, age 74, of Art, passed away on Friday July 24, 2020 after a difficult two-year battle with a Parkinson's like neurological disease. Jean was born on September 26, 1945 in Texarkana, Arkansas to Juedon and Tex Yuma Middlebrooks.

Jean's father was career Air Force so growing up she lived in many different locations. But she always considered Austin and Central Texas home for it was there she met her future husband, Les Shroyer, an engineering student at the University of Texas. Jean and Les celebrated their 55th wedding anniversary this last April. The first thirty years of her marriage found her relocating eleven times across six states to follow her husband's career assignments. In 1996 Les and Jean had an opportunity to permanently settle back in Texas where they purchased a home in Austin and a ranch in Mason County.

Ibzan Middlebrooks

Ibzan Middlebrooks (son of <u>Joseph Middlebrooks</u> and <u>Rachel Baxter</u>) was born Abt. 1802 in Hancock County, Alabama, and died Aft. 1846 in Nacogdoches County, Texas .He married <u>Jane C. Crawford</u> on Abt. 1820 in Greene County, Alabama, daughter of <u>Jesse H.</u> Crawford and Hannah Warren.

Ibzan Middlebrook was married to Jane C. Crawford in about 1823 Greene Co, Alabama. There is a story that Joseph Middlebrook, father of Ibzan, had moved to Greene Co, Alabama with some of his children before 1823. He and his wife lived there for several years, 1823-1832. Then they moved to Oktibbeha Co, Mississippi in about 1835. They left there about 1838, we have a church record that is dismissing Jane C. Middlebrook and her father-in-law Joseph Middlebrook. They moved to Chickasaw County, Mississippi.

Ibzan and Jane stayed there until after 1 Jan 1844 then moved to Texas and were there by 1 June 1844. They went to Nacogdoches County, Texas where Jane's father and mother Jesse and Hannah Crawford were living. There was a poll tax record in Texas, and it lists Ibzan Middlebrook in Nacogdoches County 1845.

Ibzan dies between 1845 and 1847. He is not found on a census or tax list. We do not find where he is buried. Jane is listed in 1847 and 1848 in a ledger in Nacogdoches and his name is not listed, most times the wife would not have been on the ledger but husband's name would have been listed.

His wife and family moved on to Navarro County and then to Limestone County to be picked up on the 1850 census..

- 1st, Very hot
- 2nd Hotter. Mrs. Bell is very low with stomach trouble.
- 4th Combs folks come to town to day to stay a day or two.
- 5th Sunday, is a very hot day.
- 6th George is going out in Illinois to visit Bacon or Charley Pearmans, the boys here used to call Charly Bacon.
- 7th Mrs. James Bell died today at 10 minutes past 12 o'clock noon. Will be buried at Monteauma tomorrow about five o'clock in the evening.
- 8th This is one of the hot days.
- 10th We are washing today.
- 12th We had a good rain today,
- 14th Rained today again
- 15th Threatened rain all day but did not rain.
- 16th Commenced putting roof on south side of kitchen, put roof on north side summer of 1888. Mrs. David Dinsmore died this morning.
- 17th God but it is hot weather today. Mrs. David Dinsmore was buried this after noon in the cemetery on the home farm. She has not been well for a long time; she has been going down ever since the death of her husband which occurred two years ago or about.
- 18th This is the hottest day of the season so far; the register reached the 100 mark.
- 19th Sunday morning, Ab & Rose Jones have a boy baby at their house this morning.
- Rose and the boy are getting along fine. Ab is as well as could be expected, this is the first boy.
- 22nd Nothing to write to day.
- 26th Leem Snider brought his wife from the asylum today.
- Thursday, Henry Martin is flying around town this morning very early. I wonder what is the matter, oh yes, I believe I know now, for I see Doctor Cove coming down from there. Cove says it is a boy and all right.
