WANDERLUST JAKE MIDDLEBROOK CATTLE DRIVE OF 1874

Since I binge-watched Yellowstone last week, this article appealed to me. I hope it will to you as well. The article was written by Dianne Middlebrooks and Sharron Middlebrook Currie and was originally printed in the April 2003 MFA Newsletter. The original article is much more detailed and provides more information. I have edited the article considerably. The complete article can be found on the MFA website, which is most certainly a wealth of history, research, and remarkable stories.

After the Civil War, times were hard in Texas. Farming was not successful for many reasons. However, states North and West of Texas needed beef; and, Texas had thousands of unbranded longhorn cattle roaming the countryside. Jake Middlebrook, age 22, of Sweet Home (Lavaca County), Texas, experienced wanderlust and was always looking for work away from home. Jake left his pregnant wife, Ellen, to work as a cattle drover moving cattle from Sweet Home to Ellsworth, Kansas, a distance of 800 miles. A typical herd was between 8,000 and 10,000 head of cattle.

They left for Ellsworth on February 27, 1874. Weather cooperated until early April, when the cattle drive was within sight of the camp on Hell Roaring Creek in Oklahoma. A blizzard ensued, and within a day's time, 18 inches of snow fell as well as ice and sleet. The cattle turned their backsides to the wind and begin drifting with it. The hardy longhorn cattle survived the freezing weather, but all 75 horses froze and died. The trail boss traded some cattle to the Indians for horses.

The drovers and herd reached Ellsworth, Kansas on May 20, 1874. They began to set the stage for the upcoming cattle sale which was finalized on December 1, 1874. This adventure cured Jake of his wanderlust. He missed his wife Ellen and yearned to see his first child.

Jake and Ellen had four more children and settled in Foard County, Texas where Jake served as a Constable for 15 years. He also established a produce business. Jake died at the age of 84, two years before Ellen's death.

The moral of the story: when things get tough, turn your back to adversity and go with the flow!!!
