Sorghum, Sweet Milk, Arkansas Sliders and Coffee

My Dad, Ray Middlebrook, grew up on a cotton farm south of Hope, Arkansas. Grandmother, Evelyn Middlebrooks, told us kids that "farming was a hard way to make a living." When the family moved to Los Angeles in 1929, many of the Arkansas, family traditions persisted.

Growing up, I remember spreading sorghum on biscuits, cornbread or toast. The only way to eat biscuits is with sorghum. We drank buttermilk, instead of what Dad called "sweet milk," (regular milk). Today, I still like buttermilk. We cooked eggs in bacon or sausage grease with a little flour in the pan to keep them from sticking. We called the eggs "Arkansas sliders." Gram, boiled coffee grounds in a sauce pan, she called "river coffee." Most of the time, the coffee was so strong, it was like drinking rocket fuel. By Neal Middlebrook *Tell us about your family.*

Micajah Middlebrooks (1758-1840)

The following is a summary of records for Micajah Middlebrooks and his family. Also, consult: The Middlebrooks Ancestry of William Sims Middlebrooks, by Margaret Goodrum, Privately Published, 2002, 42-45.and Micajah Middlebrooks...the Mysterious Micajah by Jean Shroyer and Leonard Middlebrooks 1-6, (on the MFA website). Micajah Middlebrooks was born 1758-60, in Orange County, North Carolina, that later became Caswell County, in 1776. We suspect Micajah lived in the Hogan's or Moon Creek areas of Caswell County with the rest of the Middlebrooks families. Micacjah was listed on the Caswell County tax lists in, 1787 208 acres, 1788 200 acres, 1789 200 acres and 1790 108, acres. John Middlebrooks (b. 1755) paid Micajah's taxes in 1790. We could not locate any other records in Caswell County for Micajah.

The Register of the Middlebrook Family, published in 1909, suggests Micajah's parents were John Middlebrook (b. 1726) and Ann Sims. We believe that Isaac Middlebrooks (b. 1727), New Kent County, Virginia, was the husband of Ann Sims, not John (b. 1726), the son of David Middlebrook (b. 1704), in Fairfield, Connecticut.

Based on results of DNA tests, the sons of Isaac and Anne Middlebrooks were Isaac (b. 1753), John (b. 1755) Sims (b. 1762) and Thomas (b. 1763), who were very closely related and possibly brothers. DNA results suggest that Micajah has been taken in by the Middlebrooks family and may have had a different father.

Micajah, after leaving Caswell County, is recorded in Greene County, Georgia, in 1793, where he married Ann Alford, about 1792, the daughter of William and Martha Alford. They had two children Ann (b. 1793) and Alford (b. 1795). Ann Middlebrooks died about 1800. In William Alfords will, 31 July 1822, Micajah Middlebrooks receives \$2.00. Ann Middlebrooks was not mentioned in her fathers will, having died *circa* 1800. Hancock County, was formed from Greene and Washington Counties in 1793.

Micajah's second marriage was to Rachael Ellis, 1801-02, in Hancock County. Rachael was the daughter of Levin and Isabella Ellis. They had the following children: James Hawley (b. 1805), Nancy (b. 1807), Mary E. (b. 1809-10) and Martha (b. 1812-15). Levin Ellis, the father of Rachael Middlebrooks, was identified in her father's will of 19 February 1831, to inherit one-seventh of his estate.

It is important to mention, that Micajah most likely moved to Greene and Hancock Counties with other family members. Micajah was listed on Hancock County tax digests/lists with John, Thomas, Robert, Joseph and Sims, in 1794, 1796 and 1804. On the 1804 tax digest Micajah Middlebrooks was listed with 31-1/2 acres on Beaverdam Creek, Hancock County. Micajah Middlebrook on the 1804 tax list paid taxes on 317 acres, Beaverdam Creek. The 31-1/2 acres was from the estate of Joshua Ellis to Micajah. This parcel was transferred by Micajah to Joshua Grace, the daughter of William Alford. The parents of Joshua Ellis were Francis and Amey Ellis. In Hancock County, Beaverdam Creek flows into Shoulderbone Creek, a tributary of the Oconee River. Beaverdam Creek is north of Sparta, Georgia.

In 1801 Micajah was witness to the purchase of two negroes by his father-in-law, Levin Ellis. Micajah purchased personal property from the estates of Isaac Ellis (1810), William Chandler (1813) Jonathan Davis (1819) Alford Long (1827) and Levin Ellis (1833). In 1825, Micajah was named as one of the appraisers of the Elizabeth Driskill estate. Isaac and Levin Ellis were brothers. From these estate sales, Micajah bought livestock, farming implements, crops and other household goods.

On 4 August 1807, Sheriff of Hancock County, sells the land at public auction of Micajah Middlebrooks to James Waller for \$168, two hundred acres, on Buck Creek, where Middlebrook now lives. The sale was advertised for 30 days in the Town of Sparta. It appears Micajah lost his land for not paying back taxes. Buck Creek is just east of Milledgeville, Georgia.

Micajah registered in the 1805 Georgia Land Lottery, while living in Hancock County. He was not a drawn to receive land. In the 1827 Georgia Land Lottery, Micajah was a successful drawer of land in Rabun County, Georgia. In that same year (1827), Micajah Middlebrook of Hancock County sold William Clark, of the Pendleton District of South Carolina, for \$75, 490 acres, in Rabun County, Georgia.

Micajah spent his entire life in Hancock County. He was listed on the 1820 and 1830 U.S. Census. Micajah was not enumerated on the 1840 U.S. Census, possibly meaning he died before 1840. As stated above, Micajah purchased items from the estate of his father-in-law, Levin Ellis, in 1833. It appears that Micah died between 1833-1840. His wife, Racheal was recorded on the 1840 and 1850 U.S. Census, living in Troup County, Georgia. On the 1850 census, Racheal (60) and daughter Martha D. (38) were living in the same household. Racheal was born in Virginia about 1780 and Martha was born in Georgia about 1812. Racheal's actual age was about 70.

The 1860 U.S. Census had Racheal (84) and Martha (45) back in Hancock County. The Post Office was listed as Mayfield. Racheal was living next door to her son James Middlebrooks and his wife Cassandra W. Howell. They were married 6 February 1833, Hancock County. Find a Grave listed Racheal's birth year as 1763. If this is correct, she would have been close to 50 when she had daughter Martha. We suspect Racheal died before 1870. She was buried in the Coleman-Middlebrooks Cemetery, Sparta, Georgia.
